
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Greetings AWIA Agencies and Agents,

Continuing Education Changes

From: The Wyoming Department of Insurance

As most of you know, an insurance clean-up bill (HB0062) was passed this legislative session. Part of that bill involves continuing education changes that require us to rewrite our CE regulation. While rewriting the regulation we decided to add in more changes that will hopefully make CE more beneficial to you, our resident producers!

The following changes are being proposed to the CE regulation, and would take effect on January 1, 2023 if accepted:

Removal of the \$30 continuing education fee assessed to resident producers each time their license renews.

Adding the limitation that credit for the same CE course may not be given more than once every 4 years. This will help ensure that producers and adjusters will be varying their education, rather than taking the same class every 2 years just to fulfill the CE requirement. This only applies if the course is 100% identical year over year. If, for instance, AWIA offers a legislative update that is approved for credit in 2022, a 2023 version of the update will be accepted, as the content will be substantially different from the 2022 version.

Adding the limitation that provider courses may not be renewed more than 3 times. This will ensure that providers are keeping the content of their courses up-to-date and relevant to the current trends in the industry.

Allowing for carry-over of credits. 12 hours of CE credit taken above and beyond the 24 hour requirement may be carried over to the next renewal, as long as those courses were completed no more than 120 days prior to the license renewal. All carry-over credits will count as general CE, so ethics education requirements will still need to be followed each renewal period.

We are excited to modernize our CE regulation and continue to improve the quality of service our resident producers and adjusters will be able to provide to the people of Wyoming! If you have any questions about these changes please feel free to reach out to me at any time.
